I've always been the guy who drank too much at the party. Just always went overboard. Alcoholism is rampant on my dad's side of the family, so I guess the apple didn't fall too far from the tree. But the last seven years is when the drinking really took me to that dark place. I started losing control over it, couldn't go without it.

I had never had a relationship with God before."

I tried several other programs and got sober for a few months. But then I relapsed hard. Within a week I lost my job and apartment, and I was suddenly homeless. That's when my stepdad told me about Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission.

When I walked through the doors of the Mission, I was so broken, so lost. But the people here were welcoming and accepting. They told me the program takes 12 to 15 months, and I said let's do this. I was in it for the long haul.

After the very first week, I could feel the difference in this place. I had never had a relationship with God before. But here they started showing me how and teaching me, and it was like a whole bunch of stuff just started falling into place. That was the part of recovery I'd been missing before.

Now, four months into the program, I'm not just sober—I'm also the most comfortable I've been in my own skin *ever*. That's because this program goes beyond just the alcohol part. It's helped me learn about the loneliness, anxiety, and depression that were behind the drinking. And now I'm learning to have a relationship with Jesus, learning to retrain my ways and my thoughts and become a better person.

The Mission has put so many more tools in my toolbox to fight this thing and to deal with life in general. I couldn't be more thankful!

My name is Evelyn, and I started drinking by the time I was 20. I just wanted to have fun and do whatever was "cool." But along the way I was introduced to meth, which I would continue to use for 30 long years. I got to the point where after using meth I needed something to calm me down. That's when I turned to opiates.

Thankfully, I got help and enjoyed five years being clean and sober. But one day when I was working as a caretaker for a gentleman recovering from knee surgery, I saw his bottle of pain meds and it just set me off. I took two of the pills and it was all I could think about after that. I was determined that whatever I got my hands on next, I was going to use it. That turned out to be morphine. Next thing I knew I was waking up in a hospital, lucky to be alive.

When I was released, I came straight to Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission, where a big part of my year-long program is getting right with God. Before, I felt like I was slapping God in the face. That was an awful feeling. But now I know God is with me every step. I've never felt His presence so strong

as I do here. And I know I'm forgiven and that I can do anything through Him. I've been here just under three months, but already I feel stronger, more grounded.

I am so thankful for you and the love and support you provide the Mission, because you're making a huge difference for people like me.


