

My name is Kyle and I'm 30 years old. For me, 2018 was just complete bottom. My alcoholism got very bad and I was drinking heavily every day. My fiancée left me and then I was hospitalized with pancreatitis from alcohol. They told me I needed to stop drinking, so I started using cocaine. I completely gave up, just living in my truck and using drugs every day. I wasn't going to commit suicide, but I didn't care to live. I didn't care about anything or anybody.

One day, sitting in my truck, a song came on the radio and it just reminded me about God. All of a sudden it became clear that I needed to start following God again. A few weeks later, I came to Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission. I came here to completely change my life and change the person I am. And that's what's happened and what's continuing to happen. I feel like a completely new person...like the person I'm meant to be has finally been unlocked. A huge part of that is God and what I'm learning at the Mission.

This place saves lives, restores lives. But it's far more than just a drug and alcohol program. It took a broken person who thought he was absolutely nothing, no good to anybody, and gave him hope. And it's turning me back into a functioning member of society. For the first time in my life, I feel like I can do anything. The Bible says with God, anything is possible. And that is such a resounding statement in my heart right now. I really feel that. I have optimism like I've never had before.

I used to have a strong family, a great job at a hospital, everything was good. Then I suffered a debilitating back injury and was prescribed pain pills. At first, I would just take one pill at bedtime. But gradually I was taking more and more. And before I knew it, I was addicted.

When I could no longer get prescriptions for pain medicine, an acquaintance offered me something else to help with the pain. It was meth. That's when my life began to spiral. Addiction makes you do horrible things, and I had turned into a monster. I lost my job. I lost my family, and I quickly went from being a respected member of society to somebody no one wanted to be around.

One night, I was wandering the streets and saw a flier in a window about the recovery program at Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission. Long story short, in my most desperate state, they welcomed me with open arms. I was somebody who had no hope, no self-worth. I didn't believe I was worth anything and just had such a huge hole in my heart. But at the Mission, they're teaching me how to fill it with Jesus. I've developed a personal relationship with God here, and I've learned how to


Hurting People
