I'm Not Broken Anymore

"The hurt of losing my kids was indescribable."

My name is Tiffanie and when I first walked in the door of the Mission, I was broken and lost. Eighteen years of drug addiction had taken everything from me, and I just didn't want to feel anymore.

Ironically, my battle with drugs began when my sister died from a heroin overdose. We had been very close, so to numb my pain, I started taking my husband's prescription pain pills. Before long, the pills took over and I was addicted. I spent my time either high or sleeping, and my two boys, ages three and five, were eventually removed from the home by Child Protective Services. Soon after, my marriage ended and I signed my parental rights over to my other sister.

The hurt of losing my kids was indescribable. That's when I turned to meth to escape my misery. Homeless

and all alone, I bounced around from dope house to dope house.

Thankfully, that's not the end of my story and I have the Mission to thank for that. The love, compassion, and empathy they give you here is amazing, and now I know I was missing God in my life. Today, God is in my heart and I'm a new person. I'm not broken anymore, and I've learned to love myself again.

I'm so grateful for this place and the impact it's had on my life. I've reconnected with my boys, who are now young men. And when I graduate from the program, I want to dedicate my time to being the mother they always needed me to be.

I see the person that you are today. You have become a beautiful child of God. I am so proud that you are mine and I love you eternally.
