Last Easter, just as many American families dressed up in their Sunday best and drove off to church, Dawnyel hit a new low. She'd just racked up another DUI. And instead of leading her 8-year-old boy on an Easter egg hunt, she prepared to bid him a temporary, but heartbreaking, goodbye.

This time, Dawnyel promised herself, she'd get clean and stay that way for the good of her son. And after sending him off to stay with her father in Phoenix, she took stock of her life.

"I was looking to fill a hole in my life."

A clear and troubling pattern emerged. In between DUIs, she had always entered into violent relationships with jealous, controlling men. Even when she managed to escape those abusive situations, meth use remained a constant.

Putting in the Work

With Christ's love urging her on, Dawnyel made a crucial decision: She entered Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission. Since then, day by day, you've helped her turn her life around.

Coming to the Mission deepened Dawnyel's relationship with the Lord. She's learned to focus exclusively on the things she can control — beginning with her sobriety. She's found fulfillment in her work at the Mission, which involves coordinating distribution to our Thrift Depots. After months of rigorous study, Dawnyel expects to complete her GED soon.

Now, a year removed from her darkest day, Dawnyel is looking forward to a season of forgiveness and new beginnings. She hopes to reunite with her son very soon — perhaps even in time for Easter. And in the meantime, she's thankful for the part you've played.

"Thanks to you, I'm changed. I'm finally becoming the person I always hoped I could be."

Suggested registration is \$25 per adult/ teen (12 and older) or \$20 per adult for groups of 20 or more. We highly encourage registration prior to the walk to avoid lines on the day of the event.

All proceeds directly help the homeless and needy in Northern Nevada.

Alcoholism runs deep in my family.

For years, I denied that it would get me like it had my parents. But I started drinking at 17, when I worked at a roller rink on the weekends. The party lasted decades — well into my 30s.

Nevertheless, along the way, I was highly successful. I had a high-profile job, a flashy car, and an expensive home in an exclusive neighborhood. But despite my success, I didn't feel that way. My wife knew the truth: because of alcohol, I was just barely keeping it together. After my kids were born, I agreed to quit cold turkey for their benefit. I even stayed sober for eight years, white-knuckling it all the way. When I relapsed, my wife divorced me.

Thanks to you, my kids can see how much I've really changed this time."

Without my family to keep me anchored, I dove headfirst into my addiction. After losing my house and car, I spent five months homeless in Reno. My pathetic routine involved scrounging up enough money to get drunk in a back alley. On the rare occasions when I saw my kids, they begged me to get help. Finally, I listened.



Coming to Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission was the best choice I've ever made. I arrived feeling as though I'd lost everything, but this place taught me that, by God's grace, the important things in life are well within reach. I've learned to celebrate the simple things: the food I'm so lucky to receive here and the clean clothes on my back.

Above all, I appreciate my kids. I'm working to rebuild our relationship. Recently, we met up and I noticed the most amazing thing. They weren't studying me to find cracks in a sober facade. Thanks to you, they could see that I've really changed this time.


For two months, maintenance supervisor Pat Sladek and a crew of volunteers installed refrigeration units, tore out walls, erected heavy-duty shelving, added lighting and painted walls and signs. The now 4,700-sq. ft. area includes five walk-in freezers/refrigerators, extensive storage shelving and hundreds of pallets of food and non-food items.

Our Mission food services department serves more than 450,000 meals every year as well as provides items to several dozen outside groups that distribute the food in rural areas to those in need.
