God Never Let Go of Me

Tonya sat behind the wheel, traveling with her teenage son through Nevada, on their way to Arizona. She had been clean for 12 years and had a good job as a property manager of an apartment complex. But in recent weeks life had taken a turn when her ailing mother began a rapid decline.

In her mother's final days, Tonya had returned to the drugs of her past, and her son suspected as much. "As we

were driving, he asked me, 'Mama, you don't have any of that stuff on you, do you?'" she recalls. "I said no. I lied."

Before they got through Nevada, Tonya was arrested for possession of meth and ordered to complete 30 days at a local rehab center. Upon completion, a pastor brought her to Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission to stay for a couple

of nights until she could arrange to get back home. But God had other plans.

Tonya was placed in Prayer House, our home for women, where she began a year-long recovery program. "It was like God was just leading me here," she says. "They just love on me and I just see God all over this place."

Now about halfway through the program, Tonya is wholly focused on getting well physically and spiritually. In addition to intensive counseling and classes to help her overcome her addiction, she participates in daily devotions and is growing closer to God. "Mama always told me to hold onto Jesus' hand," she says. "I let go for a minute, but He's never let go of me."

Tonya is deeply thankful for new work God is doing in her life, and for friends like you who make the Mission possible. "I'm extremely grateful that you give from your heart to help," she says. "This is an amazing program and I thank you so much."

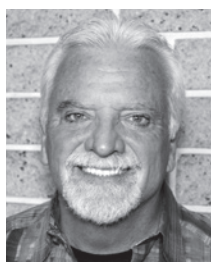
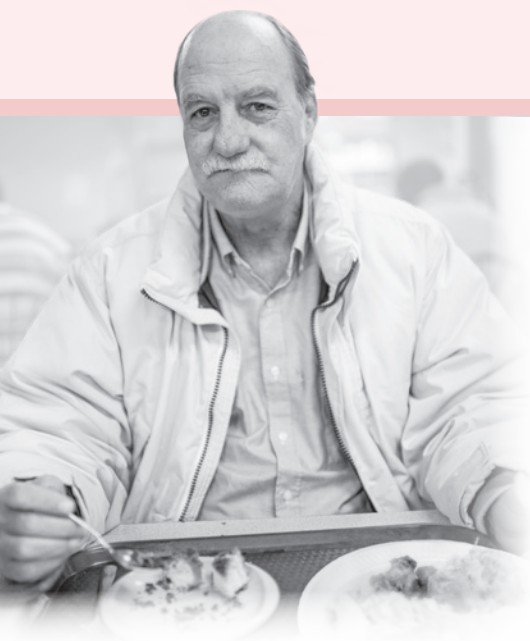
The festive event brings together more than 600 people to walk a mile in support of services for area homeless. Along the route from the park to the Mission, walkers pass out hygiene kits to the needy and inform others of available services.

Families, moms with strollers, singles, students, and folks who just like to walk make up the core of the walkers.

Local businesses also enjoy friendly competition for the coveted "Golden Shoe" awarded to the largest group of walkers. Reigning champ is Greg Latimer's Triad Plastics in Reno.

All proceeds help the homeless. Registration is \$25 per adult (12 and older) or \$20 per adult for groups of 20 or more. We highly encourage registration prior to the walk to avoid lines on the day of the event.

GOD WAS WHAT I NEEDED By Donnie

My name is Donnie and alcoholism pretty much cost me everything. My home, my job, my marriage ... and almost my life. I first started drinking back in my early 20s, just socially with friends. But after a while, I couldn't quench the thirst and it began to take over my life.

For a decade, I was a functioning alcoholic, working a job but drinking whenever I wasn't on the clock. Eventually my wife left me because of my addiction. That's when I really hit the bottle hard and when my health started to go. I was in and out of the hospital constantly with chronic pancreatitis from drinking, and I had a heart attack when I was just 30 years old.

When I got out of the hospital, I came up to Reno trying to run from my problems. Homeless, I would couch surf at the homes of friends and occasionally sleep behind dumpsters. All the while the drinking continued, which led to a DUI. While in jail I heard about Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission. I knew God was what I needed in my life to make a change. So, during a probation hearing I told my public defender I wanted to come to the Mission. She said, "What a coincidence.



I have your acceptance letter right here. You're going today."

That was two years ago, and my life has done a 180-degree turn. Everyone here welcomed me with open arms, and I jumped in with both feet. From recovery classes to anger management to Bible studies, I was all in. I even completed my GED while at the Mission.

After graduating from the Mission's program, I obtained my EMT certification at a local community college and I'm now continuing my education to get my advanced certification. Meanwhile I work in the Mission's warehouse and stay in their transitional housing while finishing school.

Jesus, working through the Mission and kind people like you, has completely changed my life. I'm forever grateful!

1. Get a new pair of tube socks — place one inside the other.
2. Stuff the sock with travel-sized items, such as toothpaste, a toothbrush, deodorant, soap, lip balm, antacids, mittens, gloves, etc.

4. Bring them to us and we'll make sure they get into the hands of the homeless!

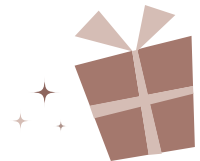
